#### 35mm SLIDES

Warren Jaenke has taken advantage of having his Vietnam slides scanned to CD.

His comment was "I should have done it a long time ago, I didn't realise how faded some had got". It is not just fading that is the problem, the emulsion that forms the image of the slide tends to degenerate to a blue tinge and eventually destroys the image altogether.

# **DON'T DELAY YOUR 35mm SLIDES?**

More than likely they are deteriorating and if you want them to last another generation you should arrange to have them scanned to digital format and copied to a CD. It is no good putting it off and thinking I'll get it done one day. By then it will be too late.

Cost - CD and first 24 slides or negatives \$10 and \$5 per 24 slides/negatives there- after. A CDR can only be written to once, so all the required photos should be gathered at the one time.
