Be sure you stop for the rail crossing and proceed down the hill past the school doing 60 Kilometers. The Police are regular users of Dairy Inn Road. At the "T" intersection near the school turn left. Cross a little one-way bridge, and just past the 100 zone turn left into Camms Road. Follow the road up the hill & along the flat to a "no gate" fence. Take the road slightly to the right through the gate and follow it to the end.

You'll be pleasantly surprised and welcomed to Cockscomb during your stay.
